Five top tips for navigating the festival

Think of these as handy hints from your glamorous, spiritual guides at Melbourne Fringe. There's no 'right' way to Fringe, but to better assist your navigation through our enormous and glorious Festival, here are our top tips.

How to get the full story

Our biggest tip? Get online. It's 2021, after all. We've tried very hard to make sure everything is correct in this Guide. But things change, and time is linear (allegedly...) so grab a cuppa and flick through the beautifully-designed pages of this tome.

When you find something that tickles your fancy, scan a QR code or head straight to melbournefringe.com.au and search to your heart's content. Our website has the latest info including dates, time, prices and accessibility information for our hundreds of events. Head there now by scanning the QR code right here.

How to support artists (and your back pocket)

FLEXIBLE PRICING

Many shows are offering flexible pricing options, allowing you to see shows at a price you can afford – whether that's full price, a little less, or a little more.

LESS THAN FULL: Times have been pretty tough. If you can't afford full price, choose this option.

FULL: This is the standard ticket price that the artist is asking for their show.

OVERFLOWING: If you've got a little extra cash and want to pass it on to artists, this is the price point for you.

How to get in (or out of...) the Zone

Use the Comfort Zone ratings on our website to help you decide if you want to stay in it, push against it or step the hell out of it.

INSIDE THE COMFORT ZONE

This zone is for user-friendly or traditional events that promise a good time. Thought provoking or funny rather than controversial.

PUSHING THE COMFORT ZONE

For experiences that are outside of the box or unique. Expect performances that include non-conventional storytelling and take you on a ride (metaphorically rather than literally).

OUTSIDE THE COMFORT ZONE

These experiences are for the bold among us looking for something equally experimental and unforgettable, something wild and out there and maybe even a tiny little bit (or a lot) of audience participation.

How to be friends with us (with benefits)

We have Facebook. We have Instagram. And yes, you guessed it, we have Twitter. Follow us and use #melbfringe for all the latest news, insights, delectable promotions and juicy titbits.

How to be COVID safe

We know you know this, but we're going to say it anyway. For your safety and the safety of our artists it's very important you follow our health guidelines if you're attending an in-person event. In-person events will proceed according to the Victorian Government's COVID-19 restrictions at the time. Please adhere to Melbourne Fringe's detailed COVID-Safe plan (which you can review on our website) to ensure the safety of audiences, artists and staff.

ATTENDANCE

Do not attend if you are experiencing any symptoms of COVID-19 or have been a close contact of a confirmed case in the past 14 days. Our refunds and exchange policy is on our website and we will refund or exchange tickets under certain circumstances such as lockdowns. If you begin to feel unwell while at an event, contact an event staff member immediately.

CONTACT TRACING

Upon arrival you will be asked to sign into your venue using the handy Victorian Government QR code system to assist with potential future contact tracing. Sometimes you'll need to check-in a few times in the one building. This data will only be used by the health authorities to help with an outbreak of COVID-19. If there's no outbreak at a venue you've been to, the government will delete check-in details after 28 days. Please see the Service Victoria website for more information.

PHYSICAL DISTANCING

Please adhere to any physical distancing guidelines that may be present at the event and stay 1.5m away from other Fringe peeps where possible. But keep them close to your heart, proverbially.

HAND HYGIENE

Wash your hands after touching surfaces and apply hand sanitisers provided at our venues frequently and liberally.

WEAR A MASK

Don't be that person (we all know one). If it's a requirement at the venue, please wear a mask over your nose and mouth the whole time you are on the premises unless you have a legal reason for not doing so. Mask guidelines change regularly, stay up to date with current guidelines.

STAY UP TO DATE

Stay informed! Don't get your health updates from your dodgy cousin on Facebook, use the Victorian Government website for the latest information on COVID-19. www.coronavirus.vic.gov.au.

ON THE DOOR

For the spontaneous and commitment-phobes among us, there's always the 'door'. The Festival Hub Box Office is open during the Festival from the first 'til last show (usually 5:30pm, Tuesday – Saturday and from 4:30pm on Sunday). But also, please pre-book rather than buying at the door where possible.

Booking fees

All prices quoted are GST-inclusive (if applicable). All phone and web bookings are by VISA or Mastercard only and attract a \$4.95 fee per transaction (not per ticket). Tickets purchased in person at the Melbourne Fringe Info Booth or Festival Hub Box Office do not attract a transaction fee. Any discount ticket offers are available on full-priced tickets only.

Terms & Conditions

We don't do refunds except as required by law, in accordance with the LPA Ticketing Code of Conduct or in line with our COVID-Safe policies. If an event is cancelled due to COVID-19, or you are unable to attend an event because you are unwell with COVID symptoms, we promise not to hold your money ransom! GROUPS

Gather your mates, your mum, your mates' mums and your mums' mates! Some events offer discounts when you book in bulk.

MOB TICKETS

Some events offer discounted tickets for Australian First Nations audience members, in acknowledgement of the traditional custodians of these lands.

PREVIEWS

Preview prices are available for some events – the artists get to test their work and you, the guinea pig, get a cheaper ticket.

CHEAP TUESDAYS

Many events offer a special ticket price for Tuesday shows.

FLEXIBLE PRICING

Pay what you can afford (or sling some extra \$\$ artists' way) with Flexible Pricing.

CONCESSION AND COMPANION CARDS

You qualify for concession prices if you have one (or more) of the following: student card (full time), MEAA membership card, Carer Card, Health Care Card, Pension Card, Veteran Card, all government-issued Seniors Cards. Proof of concession is required on purchase and at the venue. If you have a Companion Card, your companion can come free. CHILD

Those aged 16 years and under, where available. If no child price applies, humans aged 16 years and under are entitled to concession prices. Remember – children must be accompanied by an adult at all times, and make sure you check the content warnings and age rating.

We believe in the Social Model of Disability, where disability is caused by a society and environment with physical, attitudinal, communication and social barriers. We're creating a Festival that works to reduce these barriers so anyone can participate.

SEARCH AND FILTER FOR MAXIMUM ACCESSIBILITY

PHYSICAL ACCESS

Melbourne Fringe happens in independently run spaces all over this fine city. Accessibility varies from venue to venue. To make sure you get what you need:

1. Check the event listings on the website. If an event shows this wheelchair symbol, then the venue has told us that they are wheelchair accessible. There's more access information online – on each event page on our website there's accessibility info just below the venue details.
2. Please check with individual venues about parking and/or accessible public transport options.
3. Make sure you tell us about any access requirements when booking your tickets so we can better assist you.
4. If the wheelchair symbol is not shown, access may be partial. We encourage you to call the venue directly to check whether they can provide you with the access you need.

TRADES HALL ACCESS

Our glorious Festival Hub at Trades Hall is accessible through the Lygon Street entrance, with accessible and gender-neutral bathrooms.

We have a handy guide to getting to Trades Hall, as well as a visual guide to the outside and inside of the building. Visit our website to access these resources.

AUSLAN INTERPRETING

Where this symbol is displayed, one or more sessions will be Auslan interpreted. Check the 'Accessibility' section on each event page for dates of Auslan interpreted sessions. If you would like more information, please email boxoffice@melbournefringe.com.au.

ASSISTIVE LISTENING

Where this symbol is displayed, hearing loops or assistive listening systems are available at the venue for people who are Deaf or hard of hearing. These systems transmit sound from the event directly through a person's hearing aid or through a set of headphones provided by the venue. We recommend you contact the venue directly for further information or assistance.

AUDIO DESCRIPTION

This service enhances the live event experience for people who are blind or have low vision. An audio describer uses a small transmitter to describe what is happening in an event or how something looks at an exhibition. People use this service via a personal listening device enabling them to experience the event from anywhere in the space. Check the 'Accessibility' section on each event page of the website for dates of audio described performances.

AURAL RATINGS

Our aural ratings are designed to give audience members who are blind or low vision a better understanding of how they can access an event.

 **Aural Rating 100%** – entirely sound-based with no visual elements, and can be fully experienced by blind or low vision audiences.

 **Aural Rating 75%** – mainly sound-based, with visuals only incidental to the work, so blind or low vision audiences can have close to the full experience of the event.

 **Aural Rating 50%** – has both sound and visual components, but sight isn't essential to be able to engage with the event.

VISUAL RATINGS

If you are Deaf or hard of hearing, or if English isn't your primary spoken language, this three-tiered rating system will help you decide if an event is suitable for you.

- 100** **Visual Rating 100%** – contains no sound, music or dialogue so Deaf or hard of hearing audiences can engage fully with the event.
- 75** **Visual Rating 75%** – has minimal dialogue and some background music or sounds, or may be fully subtitled, so Deaf and hard of hearing audiences can have close to the full experience of the event.
- 50** **Visual Rating 50%** – includes dialogue and background music or sounds, so Deaf and hard of hearing audiences can have some engagement with the event.

RELAXED PERFORMANCE

These performances are open to everyone but have been specifically designed to create a safe and welcoming environment for people who would benefit from a more relaxed environment – this could include neurodiverse and learning disabled people and those with mental health issues. Check the 'Accessibility' section on each event page of the website for dates of relaxed performances.

SENSORY FRIENDLY PERFORMANCE

These are performances where steps have been taken towards making the event or specific performances more sensory friendly, but they may not have all elements expected of a Relaxed Performance. For example, they may make changes to the lighting and sound to make it more sensory friendly but not have a breakout area to chill out during the event. Check the 'Accessibility' section on each event page for dates of sensory friendly performances.

CAPTIONED PERFORMANCE

For these performances, captions are displayed, enabling the audience to read what is being said. Open Captioning is always in view and cannot be turned off. Closed Captioning can be activated or deactivated by the viewer. Check the 'Accessibility' section on each event page of the website for dates of captioned performances.

LANGUAGE NO BARRIER

This symbol indicates that audiences can understand and engage with the event without a comprehensive understanding of the English language.



Come feel the earth move under your feet (literally) in an immersive soundscape that is as sonically beautiful as it is visually arresting. *Groundswell* is a large-scale participatory experience and giant playable musical instrument from leading Melbourne percussive artist, Matthias Schack-Arnott, exploring how every step we take has an impact on our planet.

Taking over Queensbridge Square and open to anyone, *Groundswell* invites you to take a step onto its surface and explore. As you (and your fellow participants) shift and move the work does too, with thousands of ball bearings rushing underfoot to create a visceral wash of sound and movement beneath you. It's an ever-changing, immersive and evocative experience that sees you in conversation with the space around you. A place where putting your foot in front of the other changes everything.

Town Choir is a musical event from the minds of Canada's Theatre Replacement which reframes everyday observations as epic, choral declarations. As texts are produced by acclaimed local writers Alistair Baldwin, Nayuka Gorrie and Michele Lee, they are immediately sung out to the public by an enormous, outdoor choir assembled in Prahran Square in glorious, four-part harmony.

Conducted by leading queer artist and composer Evan Lawson (Forest Collective), and featuring singers from across Melbourne; *Town Choir* examines the intimate and minute experiences of individual Australians and takes them to monumental proportions, celebrating the singular voice through the power of the collective. It's beautiful, it's powerful and it's poignant. An unmissable, uplifting experience.

2020 Melbourne Fringe Festival signature event *Multiply* was an unforgettable participatory dance experience that brought Melburnians together for the first time post-COVID-19 lockdown. Hundreds of physically distant participants gathered in Prahran Square to bring to life a new work by acclaimed choreographer Stephanie Lake. *Multiply* was a celebration of the creativity and resilience of our city through dance.

This transcendent event was captured by celebrated Australian filmmaker Rhys Graham in a half-hour film detailing the journey to making this profound work of art. Chronicling Stephanie and her collaborators' experiences of delivering the impossible – a dance event in a global pandemic – the film also captures the full 15-minute mass dance experience that was *Multiply*.

Multiply premiered at the Melbourne International Film Festival in August. If you missed it, or want to experience the magic again, join us at a special screening at ACMI.

Multiply has been assisted by the Australian Government through the Australia Council for the Arts, its arts funding and advisory body.



SUPPORTING THE ARTS

We love the arts. Like, a lot. We want it to be better, brighter, more sustainable (single use plastic, your moment is over) and a really good time for all artists, arts workers and audiences.

So, what do we actually do? We run a bunch of sector leadership programs that work to drive artistic, cultural and social change within our organisation, our community and the industry. Through programs such as Radical Access, Stepping Stones, Money for Art, Tour Ready and our artist development work, we support resilient, healthy, culturally safe and environmentally responsible practices to rebuild a stronger, more equitable independent arts sector. Worth a lot more than a bit of the warm and fuzzies, right?

Our sector leadership programs:

- Support artform evolution and ambitious artmaking.
- Champion ethics, authenticity and cultural safety.
- Build the skills, capacity and profiles of artists.
- Strive for universal access.
- Improve representation and cultural safety of our communities of focus – First Nations, Deaf and disabled people, people of colour, women and non-binary people, and LGBTQIA+ communities.
- Incubate cultural leadership talent.
- Enable sustainable career pathways.
- Support sustainability and positive mental health.

ARTIST DEVELOPMENT

It kinda goes without saying, but we want our artists to make art. But not any old art – art that is amazing, accessible, sustainable and money-making.

Our range of artist development programs help to develop artistic skills, build resilience, as well as giving handy advice on everything else you need as a full-time artist – producing, finance, marketing, and the all-important self-care (breathe in... and breathe out...).

Resource Hub

Our brand-spanking-new Resource Hub is the one-stop-info-shop for artists.

From marketing and budgeting templates to grant opportunities, the Resource Hub is more browsable than Instagram (without those weird, targeted ads for skin creams) and gives artists all the stuff they need, and none of the stuff they don't.

Salon Sessions and Panels

All Fringe participants, from first-timers to seasoned professionals and everyone in between, have the opportunity to head back to school (figuratively... no uniforms required) and get the info they need to get the job done.

Through online 'Quick Chat' informational videos, digital 'Let's Talk' panels and face-to-face Salon Sessions, we cover everything from basic tips and tricks through to bespoke advice for presenting and marketing work at the Festival and beyond.

Our Salon Sessions are supported by The Sir Zelman Cowen School of Music and Performance at Monash University.



Stepping Stones

It's not just artists we like to see making a career out of art. Our Stepping Stones program gives professional development opportunities and support to arts workers ready to become the next leaders in the sector.

The program up-skills staff through on the job learning, industry mentorships and career planning. By building a bank of knowledge and experience in our staff, we know they not only have the skillz to pay the billz, but we are incubating cultural leadership talent to ensure the future of the Australian arts industry is in safe hands.

Our current Stepping Stones participants are Anna Nalpantidis (Program Manager Independent Arts), Alexina Coad (Program Manager Common Rooms), Ashleigh Morris (Program Coordinator Artists and Venues) and recent alumnus Lucy Pitt (now Business Manager at Western Edge Youth Arts).



Tour Ready

Shows that go on tour, stay on tour. Well, at least for a little while we hope.

By connecting artists with programmers from interstate and further afield, our Tour Ready program gives Festival artists opportunities to extend the life (and money-making prospects) of their shows, well after the last Melbourne Fringe curtain comes down.

Tour Ready is supported by The Sir Zelman Cowen School of Music and Performance at Monash University.

Each year we work with our great mates around the country (and abroad) to find some of the best and most exciting shows from festivals afar and bring them to Melbourne for you to enjoy. And it works both ways: we have plenty of touring awards on offer for our artists at the end of each Festival.



RADICAL ACCESS

After the success of our ambitious three-year Access and Inclusion Strategy, from 2021 we're making big, bold moves on our journey towards Radical Access.

Radical Access, in partnership with Arts Access Victoria, works to realise best practice in Deaf and disability access in the independent arts. It's a program that is, well, radical. The program raises the visibility of Deaf and disabled artists and places the concept of aesthetic access right at the heart of the creative process. It removes barriers to access and creates space for Deaf and disabled artists to explore big ideas and create ambitious works as central to our artistic culture. You know, the way it should be. Radical Access will launch in 2022, and we can't wait.

Radical Access has been assisted by the Australian Government through the Australia Council for the Arts, its arts funding and advisory body.



ETHICS, DIVERSITY & CULTURAL EQUITY

Through a range of programs and initiatives, we continue our commitment to reducing barriers to access, championing ethics and pushing for diversity and cultural equity in the arts.


While we know paperwork isn't the most glamorous parts of the arts, we recognise that actionable, accountable policies are needed to push things forward. That's why we've created three comprehensive documents – our Equity Action Plan, our Deaf and Disability Inclusion Action Plan and our Reconciliation Action Plan – to provide a framework for us to continue strive for equity in the arts. What does that mean? Over the next five years, we'll work hard to improve the representation and the cultural safety of people in our communities of focus – First Nations, Deaf and disabled people, people of colour, women and non-binary people, and the LGBTQIA+ communities.

Community Guidelines

All Melbourne Fringe programs and events are guided by two key principles – Freedom of Expression and Ensuring Community Safety. We believe freedom of artistic expression is vital to our culture, our democracy and our artistic practice, and allowing a diversity of viewpoints opens powerful, difficult and important conversations to take place. But no freedom is absolute nor without consequence, and we may not always get it right, but we are committed to putting in the hard work to create culturally safe spaces for self-expression, in order to champion artistic freedom for all participants.

MONEY FOR

Making ground-breaking, innovative and brilliant work ain't free.

And after the strain of the last year (we shall not speak its name), we know that for artists, pulling together the pennies they need is still a challenge. At Melbourne Fringe, we are committed to helping artists find money for their art.

Our Money for Art program provides commissioning opportunities, cold hard cash and help with rego fees to ease the financial pressure and keep artists' pockets full.

We work to reduce barriers to access and maximise participation for people facing financial hardship and structural disadvantage, including First Nations peoples, Deaf and disabled people and people who identify as culturally and linguistically diverse.

In 2022, with the support of the Victorian Government we're launching a new artist commissioning program. This will get money direct to artists, create boundary-pushing new work and up the game of Melbourne's independent arts scene. Watch this space.

JEWEL BOX GRANTS

We're partnering up once again with Jewel Box Performances to provide a tailored program of support for artists who identify as Indigenous, Black or people of colour. The Jewel Box grants not only commission original works to be presented at the Festival, but offer bespoke marketing support for each recipient, too.

Our 2021 Jewel Box grant recipients are Thomas Fonua, Melody Shotade and Malith Wijayawardhana.

CASH FOR CREATIVES AND RALPH MCLEAN MICROGRANTS

These two pools of funding provide sweet no-strings-attached cash to artists. The Cash for Creatives seed funding, shelled out in \$500, \$1,000, \$1,500 and \$2,000 morsels, helps to get a whole suite of new event ideas moving ahead. Our Ralph Mclean Microgrants help artists from our communities of focus, or who are facing financial disadvantage, launch past the barriers society has placed that might have prevented them from participating in the Festival.

Cash for Creatives is supported by the Australian Government RISE Fund. Ralph Mclean Microgrants is supported by significant gifts from a Friend of Fringe and the Persephone Foundation.



DIGITAL DISCOVERY COMMISSIONS

These juicy commissions of \$5,000 look for something special in the digital space. They focus on work that challenges how we think about digital art and performance, where artists embrace the digital form and create something that simply couldn't exist IRL. We're ready to have our digital minds blown.

Our 2021 Digital Discovery Commission recipients are Djovan Caro and Vidya Rajan.

FESTIVALS MORELAND DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

Our incredible friends at Moreland City Council have developed a brand-new commission for three lucky artists living and/or working in the Moreland municipality. The commission, including up to \$5,000 went towards artist fees for the development of a compelling new participatory or live artwork at the 2021 Melbourne Fringe Festival.

The 2021 Festivals Moreland recipients are Katrina Gaskell, Rebecca Jensen & Sarah Aiken (Deep Soulful Sweats) and Laura Trenery.



MONASH MICROGRANTS

Current Monash students are eligible for a Festival registration fee waiver as part of our partnership with Monash University's Sir Zelman Cowen School of Music and Performance. Valued at \$430 for a season of work in 2021, these ten microgrants cover inclusion in the Festival program, support from our artist services and accessibility teams, and artist development opportunities throughout the year.
