Many shows offer a special group price. The number in brackets next to the 'G' indicates how big your group needs to be in order to qualify for the group discount.

Phone and web bookings are by credit card only and attract a \$3.50 fee per transaction (not per ticket). Tickets booked by credit card can only be collected by the credit card holder upon presentation of their credit card. Tickets purchased at the Fringe Hub do not attract a transaction fee and may be purchased with cash or credit card. Booked tickets cannot be refunded or exchanged. 2 for 1 ticket offers are available on full-price tickets only. Concession tickets require a Concession Card to be presented for each such ticket booked or purchased.

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ARTIST DEVELOPMENT

The Melbourne Fringe Artist
Development Program is pivotal for the continued development of our independent arts community and the Festival itself.
The various programs and initiatives that comprise the Artist Development Program directly contribute to the sustainability of independent arts practice in Victoria.
Through long-standing partnerships with industry peers and experts, as well as other Victorian developmental organisations, the Artist Development Program provides the leadership and support that is critically necessary for early-career arts workers and practitioners.

Free for all artists, this program promotes the best of Victorian arts practices and ideologies. Via a supported learning framework, this program rewards creativity and functions as an incubator for this city's next generation of artists. Through a transparent and honest delivery model this program underscores Melbourne Fringe's integrity as an artist-facing organisation and our commitment to furthering the careers of as many artists as possible.

In 2013, the Melbourne Fringe Artist Development Program includes; **Artist Services, Published Resources, Forums & Seminars, Mentorships** and the continuation of the **Buzzcuts** young writers program.

The Melbourne Fringe **Artist Services Program** is broad-reaching, with every staff member at the organisation committed to placing the complex and varied needs of independent artists as a priority. This program includes the provision of support services to artists and producers, including one-on-one meetings, extensive administration assistance with production elements such as insurance and ticketing, and access to the skills and expertise of the Melbourne Fringe Management Team.

Each year, Melbourne Fringe provides an extensive range of **Published Resources** for artists and producers. This suite of documents provides valuable information on development, presentation and promotion of work. Melbourne Fringe resources are not exclusive to Festival artists and provide essential information on topics ranging from producing, publicity, risk management and venue negotiation.

Melbourne Fringe **Forums & Seminars** are a series of sessions that provide practical advice and networking opportunities for artists presenting in the Festival. Each Melbourne Fringe Forum focuses on a discrete aspect of skills development and includes topics such as venue negotiations, becoming an independent producer, marketing, publicity and touring. They provide a vital opportunity for emerging artists and producers to learn the skills required to present a successful Melbourne Fringe Festival event and ensure that their practice is sustainable and informed.

Melbourne Fringe Mentorships provide an opportunity for emerging artists and producers to work with an established mentor in the in-depth development of their professional skills. These mentorships provide artists and producers with vital professional networking and artistic development opportunities by matching artists and producers with established practitioners and building skills through direct experience and expert advice.

Delivered in partnership with Express Media, **Buzzcuts** offers emerging writers the opportunity to refine their craft in the pursuit of becoming better equipped art critics. The program provides emerging writers with the capacity to see a wide range of events in the Melbourne Fringe Festival and publish online reviews of this work. Over 30 writers annually are given the chance to review, edit, publish and receive feedback on their work.

MELBOURNE FRINGE ON TOUR

In 2013 Melbourne Fringe launches our debut regional touring program, **Melbourne Fringe**On Tour. This program sees a selection of shows from the 2012 Melbourne Fringe Festival head out on the road to play one night stands at outer metropolitan and regional Victorian venues and towns.

Melbourne Fringe On Tour will provide important opportunities for artists to take their work to regional Victorian venues and audiences. The initiative will see two shows programmed in the Melbourne Fringe Festival presented at selected regional arts centres across Victoria as a double-bill performance, representing some of the best of the Festival and taking these highlights to audiences that might otherwise not have the chance to see these exciting shows. The 2013-2014 tour features Emily Taylor's *Cannonball* and Tegan Higginbotham in *Million Dollar Tegan* and will travel to Kew, Kyneton, Traralgon, Rosebud, Upwey, Shepparton, Werribee and Parkdale.

TOUR READY

The **Tour Ready** program instructs emerging producers on the skills and experience needed to send their show on the road. Producers, venue representatives and Festival Directors from across Australia and internationally are invited to see Melbourne Fringe events with the intent of programming work. Participants in the Tour Ready program attend a series of seminars with Melbourne Fringe staff and visiting programming representatives to learn more about the ways that they can approach touring their work.

Annually, at least six shows tour interstate in the 12 months following the Festival as a result of the Tour Ready Program. Tour Ready assists artists and producers to create a sustainable career in Australian arts practice. The program exposes artists and producers to the kinds of opportunities they need to access in order to build a year-round career in the arts. Tour Ready assists artists to look beyond Melbourne Fringe and seek out partners and networks that will help them restage or tour their work, nationally and internationally.

AWARDS

The **Melbourne Fringe Awards Program** recognises excellence in the Melbourne Fringe Festival. All award-eligible artists benefit from the program as it affords them the chance to show their work to potential peers and colleagues in the industry, thereby growing their networks and furthering their exposure to those working in the sector.

The Professional Development Awards are delivered with the support of a range of partners and come with a cash prize and further presentation or development opportunities. The growth in the number and variety of professional development partners and awards is testament to the role that Melbourne Fringe plays in the national arts ecology as an incubator for exciting new work.
