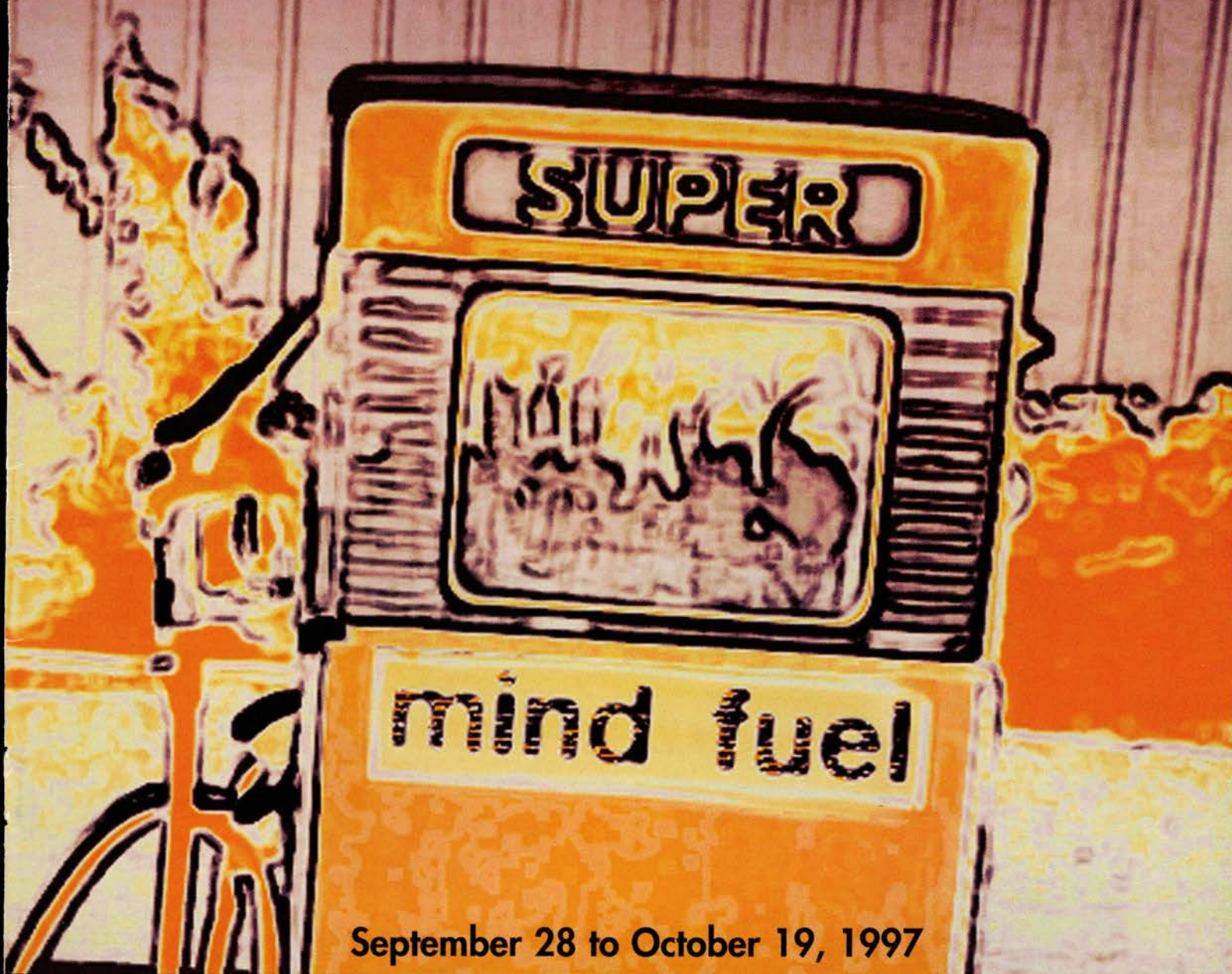

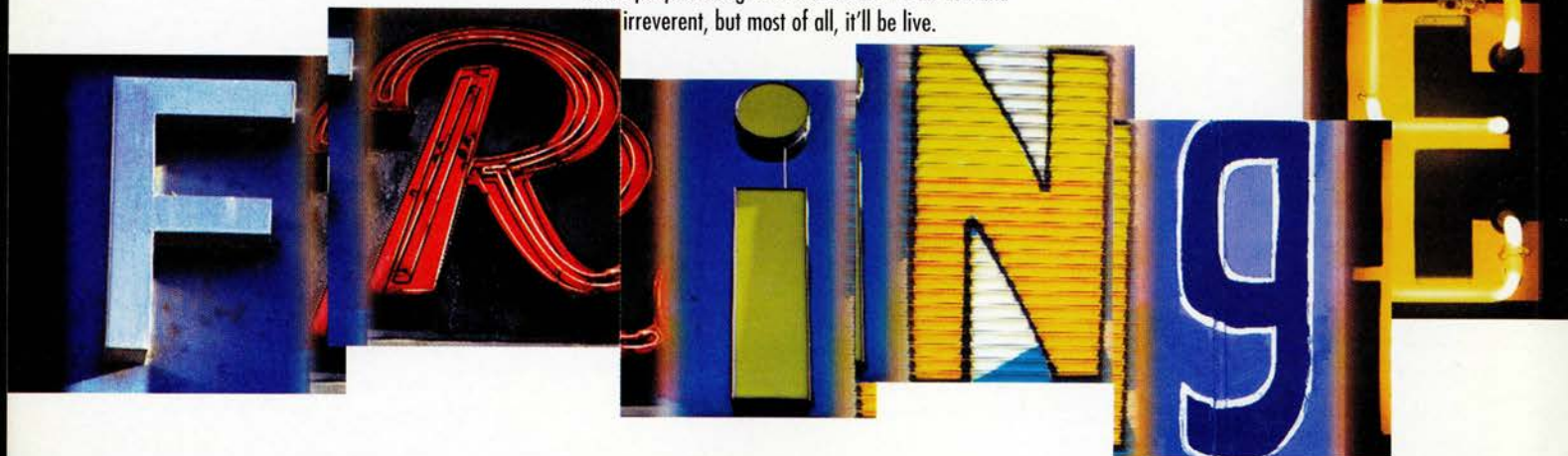
## MELBOURNE FRINGE:
