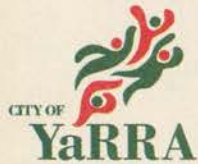

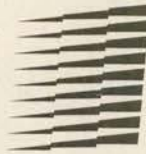

Fringe is about exposing new work and new artists, in a festival of discovery. You are not guided by famous names but works that evoke curiosity and a willingness to take a risk.

We welcome international and interstate guests to join a broad contingent of Melbourne's well known and emerging artists, in the largest display of independently produced events ever presented by Melbourne Fringe.

# Festival INSTRUCTIONS

"Where on earth is Active Earth? Who's in Heavy Metal Hamlet? What is the Estimated Time of Opening for Estimated Time of Arrival? And how much is How Much? Too Much?" Relax! It's all in here, in the 1998 Melbourne Fringe Festival Programme.

About the only question this Programme can't answer is What Should I See First? All 275 events in the Programme are listed, alphabetically by title, sorted into types of events. Decide whether you want to see an event (typically an evening show, with a specific starting time) or an Exhibition (more likely to be on during the day, and open for longer times continuously), what kind of event you want (Comedy, Cabaret, a Gallery...) and go for it!

There's also a Venue / Season Grid at the back, so you can easily plan your art-crazed crawls around a whole number of venues at a time.
