VENUE INFORMATION

Getting to Trades Hall

- Trades Hall is located on the corner of Lygon and Victoria Streets,
 Carlton. Enter via Lygon Street. Google Map Link <u>HERE</u>

- You can find audio-visual instructions on getting to Trades Hall from Melbourne Central Station HERE

Public Transport

There are three public transport options from the Melbourne CBD to Common Rooms – train, tram and bus, you can plan your journey using the <u>Public Transport Victoria website</u>.

Train

Trades Hall is located 800 metres from Melbourne Central train station. Exit at Swanston Street/La Trobe Street and make your way East up La Trobe Street. Turn left at Russell Street, and continue to Victoria Street, when Russell Street becomes Lygon Street. Trades Hall is on the corner of Victoria Street and Lygon Street.

Bus

Trades Hall is around a 15-minute bus trip from Melbourne CBD. Catch the 907 Bus from Swanston and Lonsdale Streets. Bus 907 is a Smart Bus – accessible for wheelchairs and mobility scooters.

Tram

Catch the number 30 and City Circle trams East along La Trobe Street. Alight at corner Russell and Swanston and walk north on Russell Street. Continue to Victoria Street, when Russell Street becomes Lygon Street. Trades Hall is on the corner of Victoria Street and Lygon Street. These trams are not accessible for wheelchair or mobility scooters, nor are there accessible stops along La Trobe Street.

Parking

There are a number of street car parks outside Trades Hall on Victoria Street, including an accessible parking bay. <u>Lygon Street carpark</u> is a short walk from Trades Hall – located at 204 – 218 Lygon Street.

Outside of Trades Hall

Mobility Lift Instructions.

Going Up.

- 1. **Call Lift / Open Door.** Press & hold the down button till it illuminates red. Lift door will open automatically.
- 2. **Close door.** Press and Hold the UP Button till it illuminates red. Lift door will close automatically.
- 3. **To operate Lift from inside.** Press and hold the up button until the lift completely ascends. Lift Door will open automatically.
- 4. **To Operate Lift from outside.** Press and hold the up button until it illuminates red. Lift will ascend and door will open automatically.
- 5. **Close Door.** Door will close automatically after a few moments. But can be closed by pressing the down button till it illuminates red.

Going Down.

- 1. **Call Lift / Open Door.** Press & hold the UP button till it illuminates red. Lift door will open automatically.
- 2. **Close door.** Press and Hold the Down Button till it illuminates red. Lift door will close automatically.
- 3. **To operate Lift from inside.** Press and hold the DOWN button until the lift completely ascends. Lift Door will open automatically.
- 4. **To Operate Lift from outside.** Press and hold the DOWN button until it illuminates red. Lift will ascend and door will open automatically.
- 5. **Close Door.** Door will close automatically after a few moments. But can be closed by pressing the UP button till it illuminates red.



Accessible Toilet Near The Temple







PERFORMER IMAGE / SHOW DESCRIPTION



Oliver Ayres (He/Him) is the creator and only performer in *I'm Ready To Talk Now.*

The show is an experimental one on one piece about disability and hospitalisation. This story is semi autobiographical and uses Oliver's own experience to guide you through the narrative. Since this show is done through Oliver's lens it also discusses his journey as a transgender man. All audio from the show will be through bluetooth headphones that the audience can change the volume of at any time through the performance.

This show has 4 main components - Welcoming you into the venue, a story told through pre recorded audio with projection playing at various intervals, strong music with gentle movement, and Oliver saying goodbye to the audience once the main performance is over.

This show is completely adaptable based on the your needs. The space can be made brighter and the sound can be turned down. Audio description and captions are also available. You can also be provided with a blanket and / or a sensory toy during this performance. To help us provide you with the best possible experience we ask that you fill out this <u>form</u>.

More Detailed Content Descriptions (contains spoilers):

<u>Discussion/Exploration of Disability, Physical / Mental Health and Ableism.</u>

For the first 5 minutes of the show there is a pre-recorded audio of Oliver speaking (this will be captioned for any audience that requires it) about his experience of first being diagnosed with disability and his journey through it. In this audio he talks about his autoimmune disease and his experience in hospital.

Mentions of Food

In the audio played within the first 5 minutes of the show Oliver discusses his inability to eat due to illness and the effect that had on his body.

Hospitals & Strong Medical Themes

The show is set inside a hospital room which is achieved with set, sound & projection. For the performance you sit in a hospital chair facing a shower chair that sits behind a screen while some sound motifs of living in a hospital play. The sounds may include: beeping, distant voice, the drone of machines, knocking and nurses voices. There may be visuals of a real hospital room that Oliver lived in projected onto the screen you're facing.
