As a Melbourne Fringe volunteer, you will typically contribute between 12 and 25 hours of your time across the Festival's duration. Most of the volunteer roles are located at the Festival Hub: Trades Hall – Corner Victoria and Lygon Streets, Carlton, 3053, with some shifts requiring attendance at our Curated Program locations across the city.

The four volunteer roles available to choose from are: Access Champion, All-Rounder, Audience Engagement (Fringe Greeter) and Front of House Attendant. The summaries for each of these roles are outlined below, however, more detailed Role Descriptions can be found on the Melbourne Fringe website.

Access Champion

Volunteering at Fringe is a fantastic way to put what you already know into practice. You will receive some in-depth volunteer training specific to this role and be placed in customer facing positions that focus on access and inclusion.

Front of House Attendant

Role Summary

Do you thrive in fast paced environments? Are you a quick thinker and enjoy being in the energetic centre of festivals? Then apply to be a Front of House Attendant at this year's Melbourne Fringe! Front of House Attendants will liaise with the public, Front of House Managers and artists to make sure that events run smoothly and begin on time.

This role will require you to scan patron's tickets, manage queues and seating patrons in performance spaces. You may also be required to make announcements to large crowds or help patrons with wayfinding around the Festival Hub and Curated Program locations.
