A NOTE FROM THE CREATIVE DIRECTOR

SIMON ABRAHAMS, MELBOURNE FRINGE CREATIVE DIRECTOR & CEO

I grew up in a house where we sat around the dinner table every night and talked about our day. For me, the dinner table – and, by extension, a shared meal – is the perfect opportunity to bridge the distance between us, to share stories, culture, and perspectives that expand our understanding of each other and of ourselves.

It's also a chance to listen — which, to be honest, in these chaotic times seems to be valued less and less.

I know I'm not the first to say it, but it's still true: what separates us from each other is not necessarily that we don't see eye to eye, but that we don't sit next to each other and talk about it.

At this year's Melbourne Fringe Festival, art and food collide under the theme *Eat Your Art Out* and I am interested in how art – like food – might bring us together around communal experiences, to share and to listen. Art can nourish us and fill us up; spicy art makes us sweat, provocative art leaves a taste in our mouths that we mull on for days.

This year's Festival centrepiece public artwork is COOKED, an enormous drop-in BBQ event that challenges the myth of the Aussie barbie as a place for blokes to burn sausages to a crisp. A startlingly simple, inquisitive artwork, COOKED is a starting point for a conversation. Wander in off the street, grab a pair of tongs, and while you grill, have a conversation with an artist. You'll be fed (belly and soul), you'll be surprised, and you'll be invited to ask questions of the world in totally surprising ways.

I genuinely believe there's never been a more important time to be making art. Our Open Access Program features hundreds of events made by Melbourne's independent artists,

for whom expressing themselves is more than just having fun; it's saying something to the world. It's what the world needs right now. Understanding of difference. Listening. Empathy. At a time when our own echo chambers bounce back opinions and stories we already know, it's important to find art that help us to see the world differently.

Other festivals might show you exactly what you expect — Melbourne Fringe is unpredictable. It's adventurous. Surprising. Risky. Dangerous, even. It's a feast for your mind, your soul, and this year, even for your tastebuds. For 20 days this October, the independent artists of Melbourne are serving up artistic entrees, mains, and desserts to sate the hunger for the people of Melbourne, from picky eaters to buffet enthusiasts. There's nothing more powerful at this moment in time than sitting next to someone you don't know, and breaking bread with them.

THAT'S COOKED

LONG PRAWN and FRIENDS are bringing the SPIRIT OF **DEMOCRACY SAUSAGE** to **FED SQUARE** where the hot plate meets the stage in a FESTIVAL-LONG POP-UP dedicated to the ART OF GRILLING - and where GRILLING MEETS ART.

LONG PRAWN'S HOT TAKES ON PUBLIC GRILLS

In a small dog park, we once saw a businessman eating a freshly cooked steak straight from a public BBQ. No plate, no worries, just a hot serve of grilled meat for one, then back to the office. It got us thinking. The public BBQ is something special. It'll grill your lunch or feed the masses. It's a place for multicultural, multi-culinary collision: snags alongside seafood and seitan, pots of rice, urns of rose tea, fatty lamb skewers or naughty but nice honey soy chicken thighs. The public BBQ is a genre-less hotplate where the simple instruction 'apply heat and eat' sears together offerings from across the globe, gluing us together in a way that only food can.

> And so, for this year's Melbourne Fringe Festival, together with Mikhail Savin Rodrick Projects and Mike Hewson, we're building one, right in the heart of Fed Square. Accompanied by a vibrant performance series featuring Ari Angkasa, David Williams, Ecstacy Cookbook, Harrison Ritchie-Jones, Dudu Wook and Deep Soulful Sweats, COOKED will be a place to gather and to grill, with food, performance and conversation on the menu. COOKED makes space for divergent ideas, an unburdened BBQ for people and cultures to break bread.

To prep you for your time on the tongs, here are a few tips from us Prawns to you:

> TIP 1: Clean the BBQ with a lemon cut in half, a half-drunk beer poured onto heat, a fistful of newspaper, and a sharp spatula angled to scrape caramelised bits. Contrary to expectation, any product specifically designed to clean a BBQ will not work.

TIP 2: To activate metal tongs, clack them numerous times in approaching. Should you encounter two grill masters clacking tongs simultaneously, this signifies an imbalance of male energy at the grill, Allocate one of the clackers to be the certified 'taste tester' to guell

BRING IT BLAK

BEBE OLIVER UNPACKS THE 2024 DEADLY FRINGE PROGRAM

Let me tell you, Melbourne Fringe knows how to throw a party. The sharpest, silliest, and strangest artists have always given Naarm a rough-and-tumble ride through the funny and the funky.

At the heart of this outrageous world of unique stories is Deadly Fringe, a powerful explosion of Blak culture that brilliantly collides with creativity. Putting the voices of First Nations artists first, Deadly Fringe guarantees cutting-edge performances of necessity and innovation.

This year's festival sees the premiere of *In Place*, the long-awaited new project by Na Djinang Circus. After multiple sell-out seasons, the company is back with a work that champions the role Country plays in human growth and connection.

"I like works and objects that aren't what they seem to be, particularly when we challenge our own mental models of the world," says founder, Harley Mann. "People don't see urban society as existing on Country. We've churned it up and disturbed it but there are still stories in its DNA."

To create the work, 100 native plants were put in the care of 100 community members to grow for a year, before being returned to meaningfully become a part of the set design.

"I wanted to create a work where the metric wasn't size or budget, but instead time and community connectedness."

The local plant species' unique histories inform the creative vision and physical circus movements too, but it doesn't end there. Each plant will then find a home in Footscray Community Arts' native garden where they'll continue to live and grow, together with their stories of Country.

If contemporary and experimental music tantalises your tastebuds, then *Gikilangangu Wergaia* has just the treat to satisfy those cravings with a performance built on the foundations of stories, sound and revitalising language.

Written in the context of the Wotjobaluk Nations of Western Victoria, composer James Howard worked alongside Alice Skye and Michael Julian to construct a vivid soundscape, featuring the greatest musician of all: Country.

As recordings of animals and landscapes loop between a production of melodies, harmonies and instrumental ensemble, stories are sung in the Wergaia language, and history is reclaimed.

Rounding off this deadly program of Blak arts is *Digital Echoes*, an immersive audio environment that blurs the lines between viola, percussion and internet portals.

"People will take different things away from it, based on their own participation," says Aaron Wyatt. The first longform work from the Noongar composer, supported by Speak Percussion, encourages audience members to become lost in the sound as it gradually shifts around them.

"For some it may be a brief refuge, and for others it could be a more transformative encounter."

With stories and cultures that reach back more than 60,000 years, the beauty of Deadly Fringe lies in its diverse and truthful experiences.

Whether from the banks of the Maribyrnong River or an old town hall, this year's powerful offering sees Blak creativity reach unfamiliar borders, alongside the perseverance of First Nations sovereignty.

REIMAGINING ACCESSIBLE ARTMAKING

MELBOURNE FRINGE'S ACCESS ADVISOR CARLY FINDLAY OAM CHATTED TO THIS YEAR'S RADICAL ACCESS ARTISTS ABOUT DEFYING CREATIVE LIMITS BY EMBEDDING ACCESS INTO PRACTICE.

The notion of 'radical accessibility' might bring to mind inclusive approaches to space-making, but it's not just about the practical consideration of access services for d/Deaf or Disabled people. It's also about opening up creative possibilities. What kind of artworks might exist if we embed access into their DNA? The artworks in Melbourne Fringe's Radical Access program are unapologetically and enthusiastically radical on this front, as they explode traditional ideas about their artforms.

For multi-hyphenate artist, musician and dancer with cerebral palsy Dr Melinda Smith OAM, this means harnessing the potential of assistive technology to enable creative expression. "My work Conduit Bodies combines movement, visual art, sound and a revolutionary, adaptable and wearable musical instrument called the AirSticks," says Melinda. An autobiographical memoir exploring the relationship between technology and the body, assistive tech and nature, Conduit Bodies sees Smith and collaborator Dr Alon Ilsar use wheelchairs and speech-generating and motion-sensing devices as threads in the work's creative fabric. "The AirSticks translate movement into music, text and visuals. They combine the latest in motion tracking and wireless technologies to give immediate control over gestural data, reconnecting movement, visuals and sound with fascinating transparency for audiences", she says.

With over 30 years' experience in disability and education, disability-led and accessible art is important to Smith. "It means I can achieve what I want, in my own way and time. I enjoy working with people who understand this need. I want to see more opportunities for leadership from Disabled people in the arts sector, so Disabled artists' voices don't get pushed aside."

Ultimately, she says Conduit Bodies is a work about possibilities, which naturally encourages risk-taking. "Headlining the 2024 Melbourne Fringe Radical Access program has given me an opportunity to take more risks, and to feel my work as an artist is valuable," adds Smith.

For Radical Access artist Rowena Hutson, the need to work in her own way and time has been essential to the creation of her work, the semi-autobiographical Notes from a Black Hole. She's been applying the principles of Crip Time, a concept founded by academic Alison Kafer in 2013, where "rather than bend disabled bodies and minds to meet the clock, crip time bends the clock to meet disabled bodies and minds." For Hutson, that's meant expanded timelines, employing a mental health consultant, and embedding in her work permission for her audiences to fidget, stim, or leave when they need to.

An award-winning Melbourne Fringe veteran, Hutson's Notes from a Black Hole is a comedic theatre work that explores one young person's experience of anxiety and depression. "I was once that young person, so we're using my experiences to explore these themes in a safe and joyfully serious way," says Hutson. Set aboard a spaceship and featuring Hutson herself playing the central

character both in the past and in the future, she hopes the play helps young people who have experienced mental ill health feel seen, and for wider audiences to better understand what mental illness may be like for a

young person in their life. "I don't expect us to magically heal anybody, but I do want to kind of give them a big theatrical hug."

OPENING NIGHT GALA THEME ANNOUNCED FOR 2024:

CULINARY COUTURE

NOT SURE WHAT TO WEAR when YOU GRACE THE PURPLE CARPET at the GLORIOUS OPENING NIGHT GALA? WE ASKED FAST FASHUN to COME UP WITH SOME INSPO to DON YOUR FOODIE FINEST and SERVE AT OUR NIGHT OF NIGHTS.

Scavenging is in, consumerism is out. If you're prepping your opening night outfit (optional but highly recommended), you'll find everything you need to create a Culinary Couture themed outfit in your kitchen (or your friend's kitchen, or your mum's... or your friend's mum's, which is where I am now. Yes, I will have a home-brewed ginger tonic while I write this, thank you Gloria. Salut).

ROBE À LA TEA TOWEL

The dress is put together using the tea towel and apron collection of two sharehouses, both alike in dignity, in fair Thornbury, where we lay our table setting.

The base of the dress is 3 x dish racks. One from Sharehouse No.1. one from Sharehouse No.2, and one from a secret third place (Darebin Hard Rubbish). We attached the dish racks to an elastic belt using cable ties.

Queens generally don't have time to sew. We, instead, used safety pins.

TIN FOIL WIG

It's giving bourgeoisie, it's giving paranoia, it's giving Faraday cage, it's in pursuit of a guillotine.

PAPER TOWEL NECK RUFF

To emphasise your modesty and decorum we recommend adding a goffered frill made of paper towel (unused).

CLING WRAP STOCKINGS

There are two types of people who still have cling wrap in their kitchen drawer: my mother, and people who need to rub numbing cream on their tattoo then wrap themselves in clear plastic two hours before their Lazer Eraser appointment. Turns out getting a large back piece from a bikie you met in an Ayahuasca ceremony in Geelong in 2010 is something you will regret. THE WINNER TAKES IT ALL

HOW A MASS PHOTO SHOOT IS RECLAIMING SPORTING SPACE FOR THE LGBTQIA+ COMMUNITY (AND THEIR ALLIES)

Like many young queer people, the seeds of Garrett Huxley's fraught relationship with sport were sown early in life. "Sport was compulsory for 12 years of schooling when I was growing up. Sport highlighted my differences and made me an easy target for playground bullying. And so, I spent 12 years of my life trying to get out of every sporting activity possible. I was too busy thinking about music, my hairstyle and probably liking some of the boys that were good at sports," he says. He recalls one particularly fiery exchange between himself - the class weirdo, or "poof" as he was more commonly called - and a "militant toad teacher" who was ordering Huxley's high school class to triple-jump into the sandpit. "I refused to do it. My inner body temperature felt like 100 degrees because I was in the unwanted spotlight. The rest of the class were in disbelief. I could hear whispering, laughing, someone beside me said, 'you are making this so much worse for yourself'. When he finally shouted "HUXLEY GET DOWN HERE NOW OR GET OFF MY OVAL" I took the second option. I walked away from the class, the sandpit and the teacher from hell. I was eventually banned from every sporting activity for the remainder of my schooling life and sent to the library. This was the best outcome I could have imagined. They knew nothing about punishing a kid like me. I could read, listen to music on my Walkman, not mess up my hair, and not be publicly humiliated any longer."

It's experiences like this that *The Winner Takes it All* is looking to subvert, by framing queer people to be at the centre of sporting fantasies. Part show, part art happening featuring DJs and live performances anyone is welcome come along and play sporting stars, over eager spectators, umpires, ball runners, or orange slice attendants. "There are no winners and losers in this magical world we are creating," Will Huxley says. "We've long lamented the way sports dominates our media and cultural interests. One only need to glance at the papers and TV news to see the time and space dedicated to sports over arts and culture. We wish this disparity didn't exist, but this project is a way of combining these two worlds and maybe joining hands with the sporting and arts community and making them smile!"

In this interactive art event, playful and provocative cultural deviants The Huxleys invite the LGBTQIA+ community and their allies to enter a domain that they may have long dreamed of, but never been comfortable participating in. Dressed head to toe in outfits inspired by high-camp Huxleys

regalia, anyone who's ever felt excluded from sport – whether because of gender, sexuality, culture, background or disability – will get to live out epic sport fantasies, as part of a series of unique daytime performance parties set on sporting fields, captured in a series of joyous and surreal photographs.

LEGENDARY & LOVING IT

MELBOURNE FRINGE'S 2023 LIVING LEGEND MOIRA FINUCANE REFLECTS ON HER CAREER AND NEW WORK, GLOBAL SMASH CLUB

The trailblazing queen of cabaret Moira Finucane is best known for masterminding legendary salons and parties with collaborator Jackie Smith and a diverse ensemble of artistes. For over 20 years, Finucane & Smith have been sharing their heady mix of hedonism and entertainment worldwide, earning Finucane the title of Melbourne Fringe Living Legend in 2023.

"That was such a surprise," Finucane says. "All my life I've aimed to create work that is legendary. Beyond fads, trends, and funding bodies, my mission has always been to create legendary work that resonates beyond me, into other people's lives. To be recognised as a legend in the city I love most, by a festival I admire, is extraordinary."

Finucane leapt onto the stage after a decade in environmental science and human rights – her version of artistic training. "I talk about our work as being a discourse on human rights, dressed up as a hot night out." Her seminal work *The Burlesque Hour* ignited Melbourne's cabaret scene in the early 2000s, emerging like Finucane herself from the politicised queer club culture of the mid-90s. "It was connected to AIDS, and gender identity, and sex positivity," she says. "There were big throw downs in clubs and operas in clubs, I did monologues in clubs at 3am. Don't try that," she laughs.

It was her response to the world, she says, and to gender, and to being a woman who expressed desire and passion and power. "And it was my response to exclusion," she adds. "And I think because of that, Finucane & Smith clubs are incredibly welcoming. They're wild, but they're welcoming and that's something that is fundamental to what we do. I don't think that anybody can change if they're not welcome."

Despite an enviable list of successes, gatekeepers still say no to Finucane. "My work has never fit in. I've gotten to a point where, if major gatekeepers don't say 'that's too much,' then I figure I should pack up my bat and ball. 'No' has become a rallying cry for me. An embrace of disobedience and defiance, of finding new ways into old buildings." Do they think the work is too

shocking for mainstream audiences? "I don't see my work as shocking – I don't assume that I can shock my audience. Some of the women that come to our shows, they grew up in an age where you couldn't hold your job if you were married or pregnant! I don't need to shock them; the stuff they could tell me about their lives would shock me."

Finucane's 2024 Melbourne Fringe show, Global Smash Club, marks a return, albeit with a 'future perspective.' "In Australia artists are not encouraged to hang on to work. They're encouraged to do something, throw it away, and then do something new. Global Smash Club resurrects some of our most legendary work with brand new 'what the actual fuck!' moments, in a club environment." In this unleashed space of the queer and the fringe and the underground, Finucane thrives. "The Italian word provocare means 'to invite and to stimulate.' And when you come to a Finucane & Smith show you will be provoked – you will be welcomed with radical hospitality, and you will be challenged. We create a bridge across art, and glamour, and the wild expression of self; a gateway to joy, and transcendence, and artistic disobedience. And so people absolutely have to dress up," she says emphatically. "Because otherwise, what's the point?".

ASK AN ARTIST

ADVICE ON THE OPEN ACCESS PROGRAM

Three artists from the 2024 OPEN ACCESS PROGRAM,
ASH FLANDERS (A Brief Episode), HAYLEY EDWARDS (Shitbag) and
TRICKSY COLLINS (Assigned Magician at Birth), sat down to CHAT
ABOUT PARTICIPATING IN THE MELBOURNE FRINGE FESTIVAL
as an INDEPENDENT ARTIST.

HAYLEY EDWARDS: I guess as the person doing my first Fringe show, what would the advice be from you learned folk who have done it before?

ASH FLANDERS: I'm trying to think of what advice to give you but the best bit of advice is what you've already done, which is just to dive in and have a go. Which I think is the motto of any Fringe festival. The whole idea is that you can just jump in and try something and see how it works. Have you written the show yet or are you still making it?

HE: I have lots of friends that are like, "I've put an application in and then I'll write the show," and I'm like "that is amazing." My brain is too neurotic to deal with that, so I wrote it last year and did a reading at the Storyteller's Festival at KXT. But I'm from Melbourne and I'm actively a part of the arts community here, and I thought, I shall do it at Fringe. I'm so lucky I got a slot at the Festival Hub, which is great because I was sort of thinking, if it's not somewhere near other people's Fringe shows, all my friends will be doing their own shows and won't be able to see it if it's not close by.

TRICKSY COLLINS: Yeah, look, this this is a worthwhile topic to talk about, especially for anyone who is doing their first

Fringe, which is that we've all done a gig in a shitty spot. Like, we've all done a gig in a venue that no one's heard about, that no one can get to, that public transport has never heard of. Just take all the experiences in. Don't worry. Don't worry about awards.

Don't worry about any of it. Like, for God's sake, don't worry about the Best Newcomer Award. It always goes to someone who's been doing it for years, but it just happens to be their very first Festival.

[Laughs] But your first Fringe, is your experience to have your first "Oh, no. I had to perform for only one person." These are gigs that you're going to be talking about for the rest of your career. Just having a show on at all is the biggest success you can have. You have no idea how much further that pushes you along, just by having a show.

AF: Yeah, as someone who is an actor as well, nothing ever feels as fulfilling as getting to do your own stuff and putting that power in your own hands. And, you know, then if only three people show up, at least those three people got to see me in my final form. It's so much better than, I don't know, saying lines by dead Russians

or an ancient bard or even something like *The Mousetrap*. It's nice to do something that is relevant and speaking to now. I'm doing a personal biography kind of show and I found that's where I always get the biggest response with audiences, because they can feel that authenticity and they're hungry for it.

TC: I'm doing a one-person recreation of *The Mousetrap*, and I'm really worried that people aren't going to like it.

HE: [Laughs]

AF: What sort of work do you make?

TC: I'm a comedian first and foremost, but I'm doing a full magic show for this Fringe, because I've been a magician for longer than I've been a comedian, but I've always thought that magic was silly enough that I never wanted to commit to it fully. So, I'm like, alright, let's see what happens if I put an hour to it.

AF: Better to pick a stable thing like 'comedian'.

TC: [Laughs] This is kind of my thing, though, which is I've done so many fringes now, I've done so many festivals where I finish the show and go "I don't really know how that went, I don't know if that show was great." And then after you've done 7 or 8 fringes or so, you're just like, every single one of those shows was a necessary step to get up to where I am now. Even a show that didn't do well, that no one watched. I'm realising how much whether they liked it or whether they hated you and everything you put on the stage, they're all necessary steps to get you to where you are currently. And the nicest thing about Melbourne Fringe as well, it doesn't matter whether it's your 15th time doing the Festival or it's your very first one. If you're there in the artist bar, you're one of the artists. You did it. And that goes for everyone in the crew. That goes for everyone who worked on it. Everyone's got the same right to be there. And I've seen so many people, me included, coming into Fringe as well and then going, oh no, I'm just a newcomer. I can't chat to the big wigs. No one's a big wig.

HE: We all have tiny wigs.

TC: Correct.

HE: Ash, are you doing a show this year?

AF: I am, yeah, it's called *A Brief Episode* and it's an autobiographical show about a previous show I made and the strange journey of trying to get it to TV."

TC: [Cheers]

AF: I mean, yeah, I'm the next Baby Reindeer, look out.

TC: Good for you.

DISCOVER what Melbourne's most EXCITING INDEPENDENT ARTISTS, THINKERS and CREATIVE TROUBLEMAKERS have been COOKING UP by FLIPPING and REVERSING this magazine.

AF: I'm much more of a geriatric reindeer. So, this show is about that journey of trying to turn your story into something else and then trying to make sense of your life. I went overseas at the time to have this fabulous Greek odyssey. And then, my life just completely fell apart [laughs]. It's a hero's journey, except the hero knows less by the end than they did at the start. And I've gotten to do shows at bigger venues and smaller venues and mainstage, whatever, but when I wrote the show at the start of the year I realised I wouldn't be able to put it on any time this year, I'd have to wait around for these other institutions. Then I happened to see an email from Fringe being like, "Hey artists, do you have any ideas?" and I was like, "I actually do." And I was just so excited that this is a way for me to get the show up and out of me. What made you want to do Fringe for the first time, Hayley? Like what actually inspired you?

HE: I've always wanted to do it. I think every year I see people releasing their promotion and I didn't quite have what I felt like was, the story or the skill set or just the confidence to do it.

TC: Yup

HE: Yeah. I studied acting and not theatre making at VCA. They split it for the first time. I was like, oh, no, no, I can't write. It's like, no it's all fine. You can absolutely do it. My show's called Shitbag, which is a play on Fleabag and the category of, one-person autobiographical plays by unemployed actors...

AF: I feel very attacked.

HE: ...with unconventionally attractive faces.

AF: I feel VERY attacked.

HE: So it's called Shitbag because it's about Crohn's disease and, like, colostomy bags. Shit bags. I was diagnosed with Crohn's disease two years ago, and it's sort of about that period. It's like Fleabag, but with more queer shit. Literally. I'm working on my copy. Can you tell?

AF

I think that even that school mentality is something you have to shake. It takes years and years to go, "There is no perfect way to do this. There's no right way to do this. There is no 'If I do this, this, this and this, I get top marks and everyone comes to the show and everyone loves it because I did all the right things." That doesn't happen. I think another thing is, if I would say anything to any person considering doing Fringe, it would be that we spend so much time waiting for permission for someone to go, "You are now a writer, you are now an actor. You are now a producer." But Fringe is a world where as soon as you write a word, you're now a writer. As soon as you send one email about your show to someone, guess what? You're the producer. We only learn by doing and you'll get better every time. But I can't believe how much support there is now. I remember when it was just very much like the Wild West and good luck and all the best to you. But, like, please fail, please make mistakes, because that means you're trying. Like, you just have to try.

TC: Yeah. Especially once the Festival comes around, we're a bit away from it now, but once the Festival comes around, everything becomes about, like, ticket sales and how many people you've got in the room, that kind of thing. I think every single audience is an opportunity to learn more about yourself as a performer, learn more about performing. Every single gig is an important gig to learn from, regardless of how many people are there or anything. Just every gig under your belt is a good one. So just doing Fringe in the first place is just such a huge essential step that it weirdly doesn't matter how well or poorly it goes, doing your first Fringe is the most important thing about doing it. You know what I mean?

AT FESTIVAL HUB: TRADES HALL ARTISTS AND AUDIENCES RUB SHOULDERS AT 100+ SHOWS, TAKING IN THE ENERGY OF THE PUMPING BARS, THE RABBIT WARREN OF CORRIDORS AND TINY SPACES, AND THE BUZZY ATMOSPHERE OF CLUB FRINGE. WE ASKED FREQUENT FRINGER AND SHOW PRODUCER EXTRAORDINAIRE OLLY LAWRENCE TO DESCRIBE THE FESTIVAL HUB THROUGH THEIR WEARY (AND SPARKLY) EYES.

For me, Festival Hub at Trades Hall is a second home. It's the central place in the Festival to go, check out the posters and 'onnext' screens and find something interesting to see, then, have a drink at the bar... then go see another great show! As an artist, the poster walls are an ever-present reminder of how many amazing shows you still need to fit into your schedule, and the Stomping Ground Loading Dock Bar becomes the place to stay way later

than you should — knowing you still have work AND a night full of shows the next day (whoops!).

Spaces all around Trades Hall come to life... even the car park and the cupboards. There's art of every shape and size, in intimate nooks that fit one person at a time, to 200-seaters in the heritage listed ETU Ballroom. (Tip: catch the high-stakes danger of one of my shows, *Le Freak* in there from 10-12 October!).

My advice: stick around for whatever's

on at Club Fringe – it's always
something wild. I love that I
can always find queer- and
accessibility-focused
art. In fact, whatever
you're looking for, as
long as it's left-ofcentre, you know
you'll find some

form of it going down at the Festival Hub.

A NIGHT OUT AT CLUB FRINGE

WITH SCOUT BOXALL

GPM: It's my night off performing and Club Fringe won't kick off 'til later, but I still make sure I get to the Festival Hub early in the evening to snag a spare seat in that one-man experimental clown show that everyone's talking about. The show is a hit, the guy's so young and talented, I hate it.

7:30PM: Afterwards I power through a gin and tonic in the Stomping Ground Loading Dock Bar downstairs and swipe through the clown man on Instagram. I scan through the never-ending wall of posters and decide to see two shows on a whim – one's an ensemble dance spectacular that blows me away with its pure athleticism, the other's a magic show I've never heard of that ends up going insanely hard.

10PM: Now it's the witching hour... time for Club Fringe. I head on upstairs and slip in the back of Fringe Common Rooms, one of my favourite performing spaces in Melbourne. I sip a bev from the bar while I survey the who's who of the independent arts community.

10:30PM: The perfect smorgasbord of Fringe offerings is well underway. You get a little showcase of half a dozen disgustingly talented acts. Tonight, the crowd's up for anything, any genre, any gender, as long as it's good. The performers leave everything on

that stage... costumes, lighter fluid, nipple tassels, props, sweat, hopes and dreams. You genuinely never know what you'll get at a Club night, but that's perfect for a Sagittarius like me. I feel Cultured. Like I've got my Finger. On. The. Pulse. I make a mental note of a couple of acts I want to follow up on, maybe see their shows next week

11:30PM: On the balcony, for a breath of fresh air between acts, I end up chatting to the clown man and he is actually very nice. We bond over clown school trauma and he introduces me to his hot clown boyfriend.

12:15AM: The dancefloor opens up and we descend together into a sweaty mess of limbs.

3AM: The Festival Hub bathrooms have immaculate lighting. I look at myself in the mirror and think, "Thank Christ I came out tonight and didn't just lie in bed at home looking at ticketing reports and waiting for my show reviews to come through."

There genuinely isn't another place in the world like Club Fringe.

Adena is an acclaimed opera and theatre director here and internationally, and for the first time she's working in a completely new form. Flames is a three-channel video artwork about transgression, about the body, about the sexuality of teenagers and what they can and can't consent to. It's part documentary, part immersive art film, and it uses ten years of documentation of a cohort of young people who are now in their 20s but first began working with Adena over a decade ago on her controversial production of The Bacchae. The work tracks how the views of these performers have changed over the past decade in the context of huge social changes.

BODY AND GENDER IN TAIWANESE PERFORMANCE

TWO OF TAIWAN'S MOST GROUNDBREAKING CONTEMPORARY AND **EXPERIMENTAL ARTISTS** ARE BRINGING THEIR WORK TO MELBOURNE AS PART OF THE INTERNATIONAL COLLABORATION PROJECT, FRINGE FOCUS TAIWAN.

What do stacks of tomatoes and 80s-era female behaviour instruction manuals have in common? They're launching pads for two of Taiwan's boldest experimental contemporary performance artists to explore the body, sex, sexuality, and gender.

In performance artist CHOU Kuan Jou's provocative and playful dance piece TOMATO, the sweet and seedy fruit becomes the ultimate symbol of sexuality. Smooth and ripe, firm and succulent, it begs the question: is there any sexier fruit than a tomato? In many Asian cultures, sex education is often undervalued, leaving people to explore their sexual desire and make understanding to their gender identities through media, screen representations, and, of course, pornography. TOMATO offers itself as a new platform for people to navigate lust, delving into the complexities of sexuality and gender diversity through the language of dance.

CHOU is excited to see how the Melbourne audience contributes to the shape of TOMATO. Each city, and each person in that city, has a unique relationship with their body and exclusive experience with sex. The artist expects Melbourne to bring its distinct energy to this performance. CHOU hopes the audience will walk into the space with an eagerness to reevaluate their imagination on sex, and that they will walk out with

a craving for tomatoes.

Leaving audiences with something to chew on is also at the heart of SU PinWen's Girl's Notes. The work's title originates from a book published in Taiwan in 1984, offering a 'how-to' guide to all girls on everything from dating to beauty tips. As the title suggests, it's aimed at 'girls' who are yet to be women. In this experimental

physical performance, SU is joined on stage by a pianist, and carries a copy of Umberto Eco's History of Beauty on their head, interrogating notions of gender and the power dynamics of women's sexuality within relationships.

SU first created Girl's Notes in 2018, due to the lack of feminist works and extensive discussion around gender in their creative circle. SU's desire is to utilise dance and physical movement to start the conversation around gender and feminism.

Girl's Notes delves into the social expectations placed on women and non-binary people in Taiwan.

SU suggests you bring a friend to the show whether it prompts laughter or tears, Girl's Notes will be a memorable experience that will provoke discussion with your companion well into the night. 女生是不是應該要這樣才可以?如果你曾經問過自己這個問題,也許那些扛在 《少女須知》表 演者身上的重量,其實也揹負在你身上。

台灣女性主義藝術家蘇品文想透過《少女須知》,以「裸/身」將身體意象傳 達給觀眾。蘇品 文希望看完演出的觀眾都能隨著那本近乎兩公斤重的《美的 歷史》從演出者頭上被解除時,感 受到一股釋然。台灣社會對女性加諸的框 架更貼近西方語境中的代表出生指定生理性別的female,而不是意謂社會性別 的women - 墨爾本的觀眾也許能透過《少女須知》感受到東亞女性的處境。

或軟或硬,堅挺卻又汁液橫流 …… 如果情慾可以被物化的話,也許番茄是最 貼切的形象。

台灣藝術家周寬柔的作品TOMATO運用對感官上的衝擊讓「性化」身體的過 程成為參與的一部份。不同於傳統舞蹈表演局限於視覺及聽覺體驗,TOMA-TO也有意刺激觸覺、嗅覺,甚至是味覺。番茄的味道及觸感,還有舞台上的 每個動作,都在你的體內產生化學反應。

在性教育相對不被重視的亞洲國家,人們只能透過網路、媒體、還有A片文化 窺探情慾的樣貌。TOMATO試圖提供給觀眾在這些平台以外,一個可以探索 個人欲望 性別身分的空間。

周寬柔希望觀眾可以帶著探索自身情慾的好奇心進場,而在表演結束時,帶著 對番茄的「饞」離開。





MELBOURNE FRINGE'S EXPERIMENTAL ART FOR KIDS PROGRAM CURATES BIG IDEAS FOR THE EXTRA SMALLS

A group of YOUNG PEOPLE AGED 9 TO 12 from the creative studio HOUSE OF MUCHNESS (HOM) gathered to INTERVIEW Melbourne

Fringe CREATIVE DIRECTOR SIMON ABRAHAMS about this year's XS PROGRAM. On the agenda: EXPERIMENTAL ART, EXPLOSIONS, ALEXANDER MCQUEEN, and 'VERY CONTEMPORARY DANCE.'

HOUSE OF MUCHNESS: XS is about experimental art for kids. What do you personally see as "art" - and what is "experimental"?

SIMON: Great question! I think anything can be art if the artist intends it to be and has something to say. Experimental art, however, breaks new ground, and does things that no-one else has thought of yet.

HOM: That's what I like to see - things that haven't been invented yet.

SIMON: That's what our XS program is about - artists making things that haven't been made before. What other kind of things do you like to see?

HOM: Explosions - different things mixed together. Weird and wacky stuff. Performance art where people do random things and you figure out your own reasons why they're doing it. Very contemporary dance. Fashion, like Alexander McQueen. Art that's not in a box.

Does XS include art for all kinds of kids. who have different interests, the same way that there are different types of arts for adults who like different things?

SIMON: Yes! XS sits alongside the Fringe Kids program, so there all sorts of events for all sorts of kids. XS has a couple of amazing events for kids who are into ambitious and imaginative ideas, including an interactive event and wild contemporary dance.

HOM: How do you get the ideas for XS? Do you think of them or do people come to you?

SIMON: XS is a collaboration. For example, Lasked Melanie Lane (an amazing choreographer) if she'd consider making a work for children. She said yes, and then took that provocation to make something new with her own team. We then help bring that to an audience.

HOM: We watched some videos of Melanie's work. It looks interesting and powerful and strange will Dream Swamp be these things, and fun?

SIMON: Yes, Melanie's work is all of these things and more. It's definitely fun and absolutely mind blowing. Dream Swamp is, well, like being in a dream, where nothing quite makes sense but it feels very powerful. Another work we have in XS is Best. Party. Ever, which is an interactive event on Zoom.

HOM: Wait, is this connected to lockdown??

XS is Melbourne Fringe's SPECIAL PROGRAM of EXPERIMENTAL, **CONTEMPORARY** and **LIVE** ART for KIDS. With BIG **IDEAS** perfect for LITTLE MINDS, it's an INVITATION to THINK DIFFERENTLY about what ART for YOUNG PEOPLE (and their grownups) CAN BE.

Haha, no! It's for kids whose grandparents live in different places to them. This work is all about bringing people together and connecting them even though they live far apart.

HOM: Do you think there should be more XS type content in the everyday world?

SIMON I would love to see more experimental and contemporary art for kids in

> museums, galleries and theatres. Too often work for kids is educational, conventional, boring, I want ambitious and bold work for kids everywhere. What about you? Why do you think experimental art is important

HOM: Because it expands your mind, and then you go "Oh that's actually possible - wow." And it helps you be more creative. If people are exposed to experimental art when they're young, they'll grow up to be people who are aware, and can help other people experiment, and lead them to the world of experimental play and... well, experimental everything!



AFTERNOON: Head to The Bowery Theatre in St Albans to check out Ada, Asmin & The Analytical Engine with the family. Then, explore the vibrant food scene at Big Sam's, the affectionate acronym for St Albans Market, home to fresh produce and diverse cuisines.

EVENING: Make your way back to The Bowery for an evening performance of Body of Knowledge, Samara Hersch's thought-provoking meditation on age and change (leave the kids at home for this one). Questions of boundaries, sexuality, pleasure, shame, pain, consent, ageing, grief, and death are all on the table in this inter-generational conversation.

SOUNDTRACKS TO THE STARS (SCIENCEWORKS AND THE STREETS OF NEWPORT)

MORNING: Sick of brunches? Spend a Sunday morning differently with a blacksmithing workshop at Waterside Forge. If you stick around, afterwards you can catch Fringe show The Beowulf Manuscript: A Performed History, which takes place in the working blacksmith forge.

AFTERNOON: Admire artwork and architecture in the former industrial building of The Substation. The Substation also has a smorgasbord of Fringe events happening, for kids and grown-ups alike, including visual arts exhibitions and a contemporary dance show for kids, Dream Swamp.

EVENING: Round out the day to cinematic soundscapes at Scienceworks. In K Mak at the Planetarium, cello, violin, synths, beats and vocals will accompany your visual journey across the cosmos. Still feel like you need to get your steps up? Then Transmission - into the dark will take you through the suburban streets of Newport, led by a mysterious radio broadcast.

SWEET SPECTACLE IN FOOTSCRAY

Melbourne Fringe Festival.

MORNING: You'll need your strength for all the artistic excitement to come later, so source a hearty breakfast at the Footscray Market.

EVENING: As the sun sets, pop into Pride of our Footscray Community Bar (another Fringe venue!) to see Radio Wet: Came to Affinity. Or, on Sunday 13 October, head to Maddern Square for Free Fairy Floss, a one-evening-only surreal and surprising outdoor performance by Niow. Expect live music, aerial performance and, of course, fairy floss.
