Event facilitation by a member of the neurodivergent arts community	The performance day in question is overseen by an arts professional with lived experience of, and connection with, the neurodivergent community. They will oversee the process, giving FOH staff a briefing, introducing the show to the audience, and being on hand to assist with any incidents related to sensory overwhelm.	Y	
Confirmed available Quiet Room	A quiet room is available for patrons to use at their discretion. This room should be set up in line with advice from a neurodivergent consultant.	-	In lieu of a dedicated quiet space we are able to provide a "low-capacity" zone. This area is accessible from the main event space and is aimed to provide a low-stimuls space to decompress in the fresh air.
Extra FOH staff for the event day	1-2 extra staff should be included to help deliver this specific performance. Staff who have training and/or experience with neurodiversity preferred.	Y	We will have an additional FOH staff member present

How to get there

Artemisia Gallery & Event Space is a dark green coloured building with a big front window, located on High St in Windsor.

TRAM & WALKING

- Take the no. 6: Melbourne University Glen Iris and get off at stop 32 Bangs St/Hornby St and cross the road.
- Take the no. 78: North Richmond Balaclava via Prahran and get off at stop 45 High Street. Then walk 250m down High Street.

TRAIN & WALKING

- Take the Sandringham line train (from Flinders St, Richmond or South Yarra station towards Sandringham) and get off at Windsor Station.
- Walk north on Chapel Street in the direction of Richmond and turn right onto High Street. Then walk 250m down High Street.

CAR PARKING

- Limited parking is available on the street.
- A multi-storey car park is located at 8-14 King Street, Prahran a couple of blocks away from the gallery.
- Be careful to obey signs when parking on-street as ticket inspectors frequent the area



The Venue

Artemisia Gallery & Event Space is a long skinny building with an outdoor courtyard at the back. There is a small entryway with a front desk, and the main gallery room is in the middle of the space. There will be chairs and staging set up in the main gallery room. The bathrooms are located outside in the courtyard, in the back-right-corner next to the bar.

The Low Capacity Zone is accessible from the main gallery room.

Content Advice

This work contains exploration and discussion of some potentially triggering themes:

- Grief, Death and Loss: the main character Billy speaks about his experiences of different kinds of grief in losing a close friend, his uncle and father. The work also explores the grief of losing community and sense of self.
- Suicide, Suicidal Ideation and Self-Injury: a big part of the main character's journey is their relationship to suicidal ideation and living with these thoughts and feelings. The secondary character dies by suicide and the emotional ramifications of this are explored via the main character Billy.
- These are recurring themes throughout the play.

The production design contains the following elements:

- projection of an ocean scene, interspersed with clips of the secondary character
- audio of the secondary character
- audio of ocean and wave sounds
- small recorded music elements (cello)
